#### **Newspapers.com**

With a free card, Cass County residents have access to Mid-Continent's many genealogy databases, including Newspapers Library Edition, on their website.

#### **Chronicling America**

An ongoing project from the US Library of Congress containing digitized and searchable pages from nearly 3,500 newspaper titles. Users can also utilize the U.S. Newspaper Directory to locate newspapers in repositories across the country.
